




2 PHYSICAL VIOLENCE

The study was conducted in five sites in collaboration with International Centre for Research on Women (ICRW) between January-March 2015

Adaptation of existing GBV screening tool, development of a resource booklet, directory of supportive services, and programme protocol

Organizations benefited from GBV-specific and gender sensitivity training, along with on site mentoring

Key population members and PLHIV were offered screening while they accessed HIV counseling, testing, or care and support services






