



JSI CONTRIBUTES TO PRIVATE SECTOR ENGAGEMENT FOR RMNCH+A SERVICES IN INDIA

Private medical practitioners are preferred health service providers across the socio-economic spectrum in India, but private sector engagement in government programs to improve reproductive, maternal, newborn, child, and adolescent health (RMNCH+A) services has been suboptimal.

Through Vriddhi, JSI works to increase public-private partnership (PPP) for health, which will be crucial to increase access to high-quality RMNCH+A service delivery and improve RMNCH+A outcomes.
