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HEALTH SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT

Strong supply chains save lives. JSI is committed to ensuring that people have on-demand access to high-quality, affordable health supplies where, when, and how they want to receive them. With the Government of Tanzania, JSI leads initiatives to enhance health supply chain management. Notable achievements include the deployment of remote temperature monitoring devices, warehouse optimization and standardization, installation of warehouse in a box, and implementation of Epicor ERP at Medical Stores Department, across Tanzania and Zanzibar, ensuring proper vaccine storage, and strengthening warehouse management systems at central vaccine store, further enhancing the efficiency of vaccine distribution and minimizing wastage.



PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

From prevention and rehabilitative services to providing health education and promotion, primary health care addresses all general health issues of the individual, family, and community throughout a person's lifetime. JSI's engagement in primary health care revolves around reinforcing immunization efforts and enhancing access to essential services. Through initiatives like GAVI Targeted Country Assistance, we supported the transition to a single-dose HPV vaccination strategy, expanding coverage and efficacy. Our work encompasses capacity strengthening for health care workers, enabling them to deliver quality care to all Tanzanians.

GLOBAL HEALTH SECURITY

In alignment with global health security priorities, JSI collaborates with key stakeholders to support disease surveillance and response mechanisms. Our interventions aim to enhance preparedness against infectious disease outbreaks and vector-borne illnesses, including malaria, ensuring timely detection, containment, and mitigation.

DIGITAL HEALTH

JSI is a pioneer in health information systems and logistics management technology. Recognizing the transformative potential of digital technologies, JSI champions the integration of digital health solutions into Tanzania's health systems. We facilitated the implementation of innovative tools like the Vaccine Information Management System in Tanzania and Zanzibar, streamlining data collection, reporting, and decision-making processes.

IMMUNIZATION

At JSI, we work to create and strengthen sustainable systems that enable people of all ages to receive vaccines through local providers as part of a comprehensive health care program. In Tanzania, we supported the introduction and rollout of cold chain remote temperature monitoring up to the health facility level, rolled out HPV vaccination campaigns, and established robust monitoring and evaluation frameworks. Through our partnerships, we strive to achieve universal immunization coverage, safeguarding the health of Tanzanian communities.





MATERNAL HEALTH

JSI is committed to improving maternal health outcomes through focused interventions and capacity strengthening initiatives. We are committed to enhancing access to quality maternal health services, reducing maternal mortality rates, and promoting maternal well-being. Through collaborative efforts with local stakeholders, we aim to ensure that every woman receives the care and support she deserves during pregnancy, childbirth, and the postpartum period.



HIV AND HEALTH SYSTEMS STRENGTHENING

JSI plays an essential role in strengthening health systems so they can more effectively respond to the HIV epidemic. Our comprehensive approach encompasses capacity strengthening and exchange, policy development, and strategic planning to enhance HIV prevention, treatment, care, and support services. By integrating HIV services into existing health care frameworks and fostering multisectoral collaboration, we strive to achieve sustainable progress toward epidemic control and better health outcomes for all.
