Da Nang

City Profile

Da Nang City is one of the five municipalities of Vietnam, and is the socio-economic center of the Highland-Central Region. It has developed rapidly over the last 20 years, with a population of more than 1.1 million in 2019 and a 5-year growth rate (2015-2019) of about 7.6 percent. The city is now one of the most attractive destinations for tourists in Vietnam.¹

In 2019, Da Nang had a total of 86 medical service facilities with 7,460 beds, including 7 private hospitals with 968 beds. Secondary public care is provided via the hospitals (city and district levels), while primary public care is provided by 56 commune medical service units. In 2019, there were about 4.5 million medical visits in Da Nang (73 percent public). This did not include the number of visits to private clinics. In addition, Da Nang had one of the highest rates of health insurance participation in the country in 2019; 98 percent of Da Nang citizens had health insurance, exceeding the government target of 95 percent.²

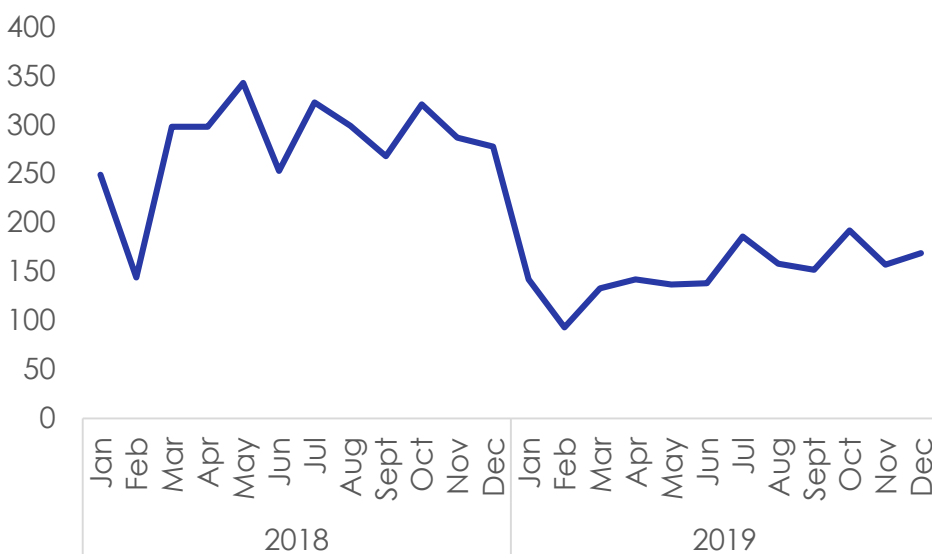

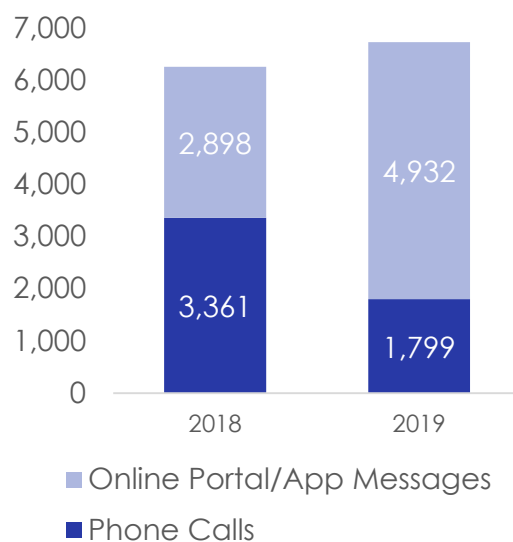

Switchboard 1022 is a phone number that residents and tourists can use to both report issues/complaints to the city government, or request information on a variety of topics. Complaint and information topics include the economy, security, tourism, government services, electricity/water outages, addresses and directions, landmarks, and cuisine, among others. The topic that complaints most frequently mentioned in 2018-2019 was the environment, followed by urban infrastructure, security, and traffic safety. In order to use the switchboard 1022, landline phones in Da Nang can simply dial 1022 directly. Mobile phones in Da Nang or landline phones in other provinces must call (0236) 1022.

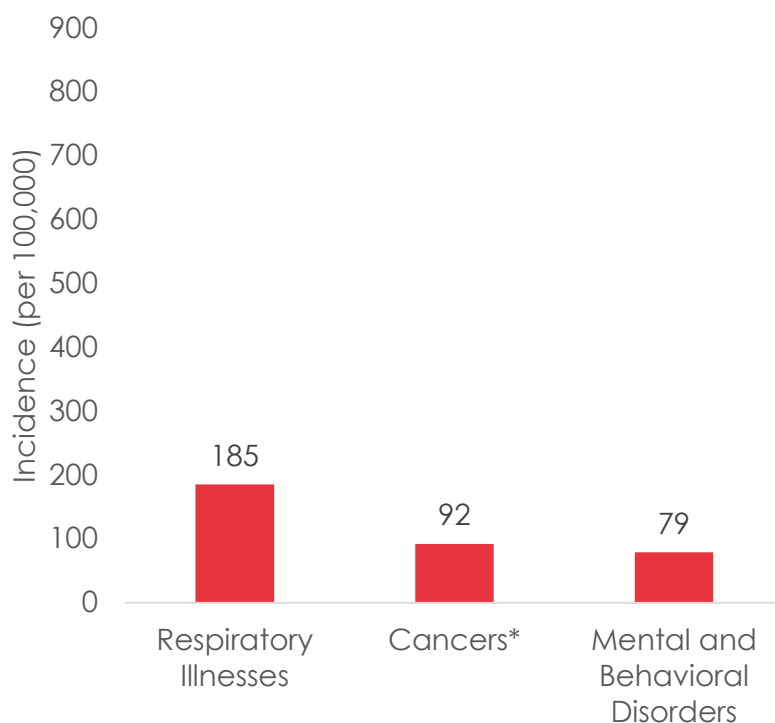
Recently, 1022 added an online portal and mobile app through which users can also submit comments or complaints. In 2019, more comments were submitted through the portal and app than by phone, as users became more familiar with these new platforms.

Noncommunicable Disease and Risk Factors

- The Da Nang Department of Health tracks the number of cases of hypertension and diabetes. Building Healthy Cities was unable to access prevalence data for these diseases.
- In 2019, **100 percent** of health stations of communes and wards screened for hypertension.
- In 2019, **45 percent** of health stations of communes and wards screened for diabetes.

Incidence of noncommunicable diseases, 2019

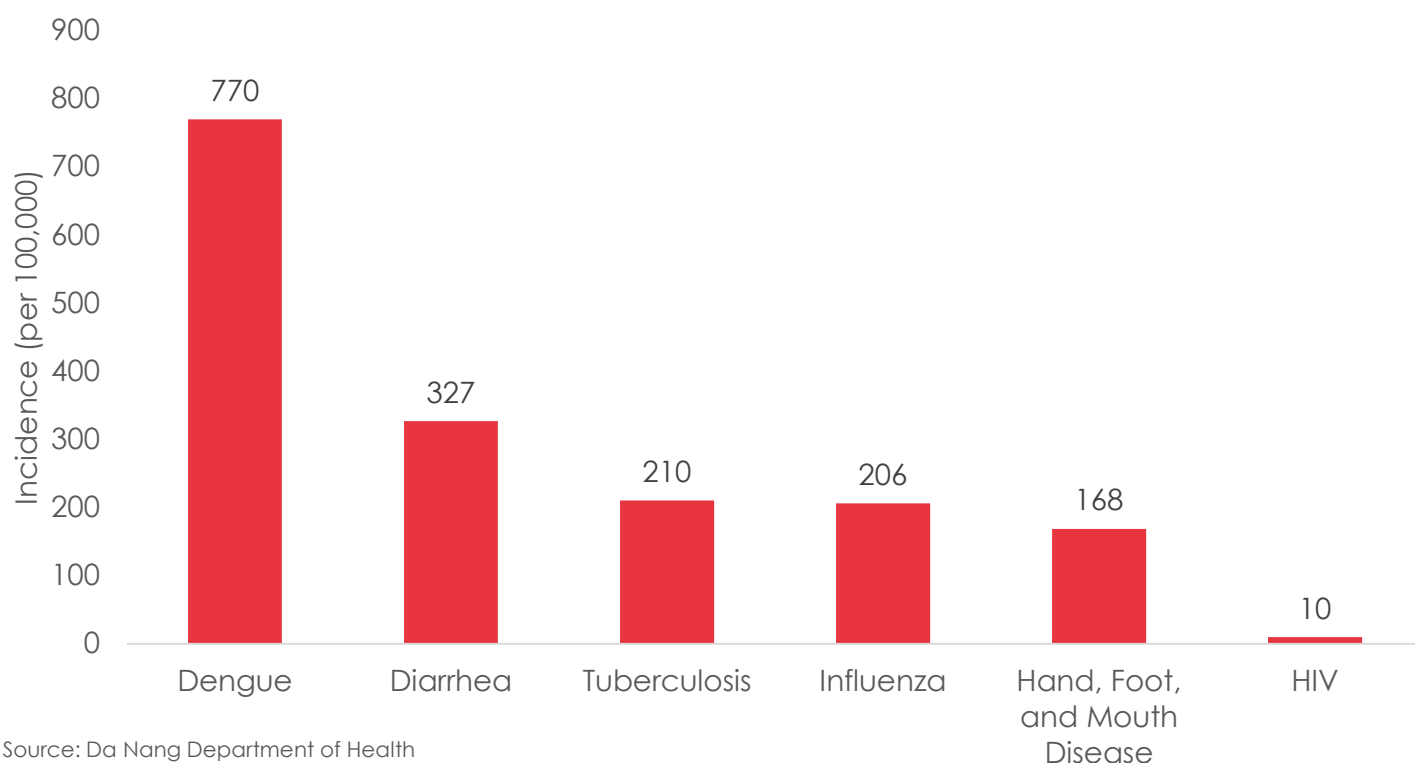

Incidence of communicable diseases, 2019

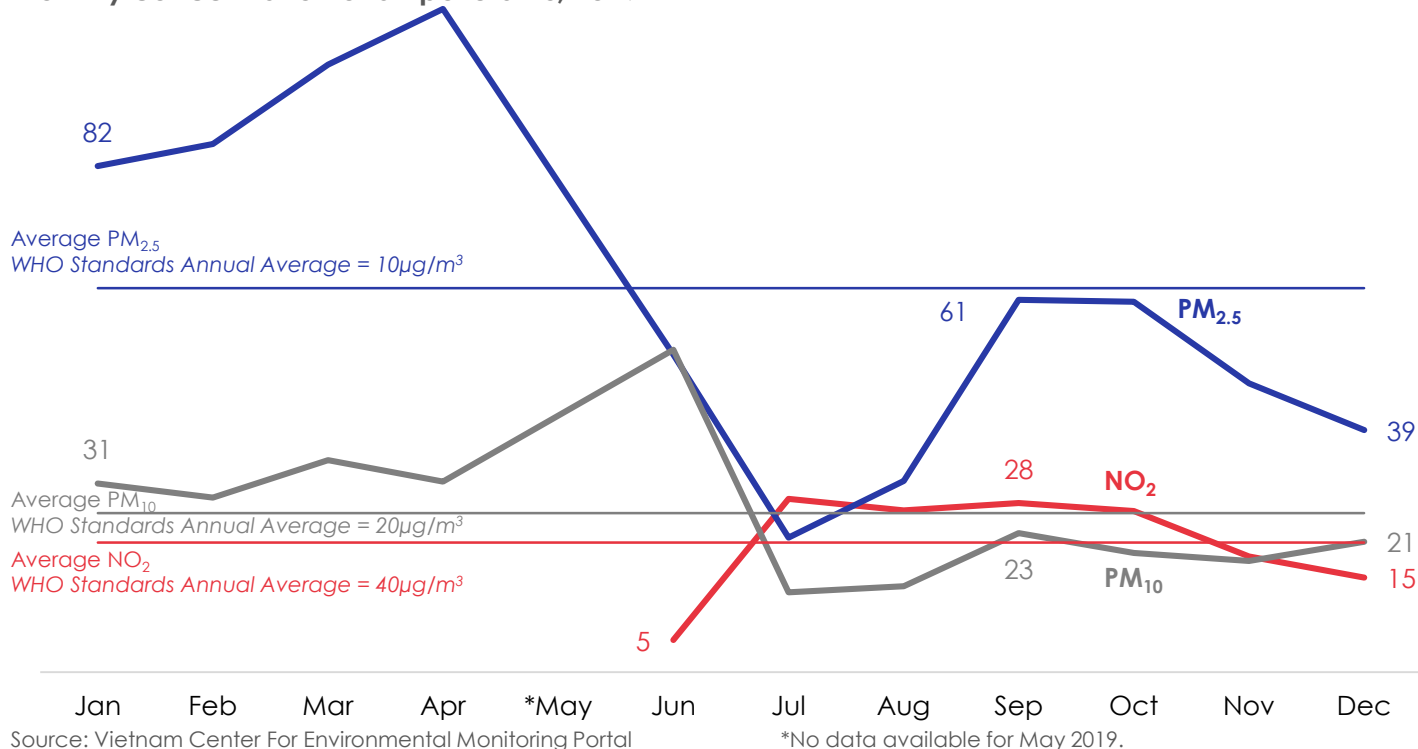
