





SUPPORTING THE PROVINCIAL TB CONTROL PROGRAM TO IMPROVE GLOBAL HEALTH SECURITY

The USAID Integrated Health System Strengthening and Service Delivery (IHSS-SD) Activity is supporting Pakistan's Provincial Tuberculosis Control Program (PTP) to improve case detection for drug-resistant tuberculosis (DR-TB) and drug-sensitive TB (DS-TB) in three districts in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) (Charsadda, Lakki Marwat, and Swat) and two districts in Sindh (Qambar Shahdadkot, Larkana).

For clients who presented with symptoms, IHSS-SD worked with PTP to identify TB index cases, conduct contact tracing, and collect and test sputum samples. During visits to traced contacts of TB index cases, IHSS-SD conducted awareness sessions to increase communities' knowledge of TB, including prevention strategies and treatment methods. IHSS-SD also partnered with PTP to establish and/or refurbish three satellite Programmatic Management of Drug-resistant TB (PMDT) sites. IHSS-SD provided five GeneXpert machines to five hospitals and is training laboratory technicians to use the machines. Since January 2021, PTP and IHSS-SD together have reached more clients and improved the quality of TB services in both provinces.
