Tuberculosis Implementation Framework Agreement (TIFA)

Through direct engagement with local governments and partners, TIFA co-designs TB commitment grants that accelerate countries' progress toward national and global TB targets.

How We Work

National TB Programs (NTPs) and USAID Missions are committed to meeting TB targets outlined in national strategic plans. To help achieve their objectives, TIFA works with country partners to develop fixed amount awards—known as **TB commitment grants**—contracts, or other awards to support priority activities. National TB Programs and USAID identify country priorities; TIFA then facilitates an efficient phased approach with recipients to co-design the grant.

Once awarded, recipients implement their grants and submit milestone deliverables for payment. USAID and TIFA verify milestone deliverables and monitor the progress of implementation. Through the co-design process and during implementation, grant recipients and TIFA identify and address capacity strengthening opportunities for effective management of their TB response.
