EXECUTIVE SUMMARY • FY2023: OCTOBER 1, 2022 - SEPTEMBER 30, 2023

The USAID Zambia District Coverage of Health Services Project (USAID DISCOVER-Health) contributes towards HIV epidemic control, while also providing reproductive health and family planning, and maternal and child health services and products. In 2022, it was formally expanded to support the Government of Zambia in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. The USAID-funded project is implemented by JSI Research & Training Institute, Inc. (JSI) from 2015-2025.

DELIVERING LIFE-SAVING HEALTH SERVICES ACROSS ZAMBIA

USAID DISCOVER-Health delivers assistance directly through a national network of outreach clinics and sites. The Project takes health services to underserved communities, which are often in the remotest and poorest parts of the country. By the end of FY23, the Project was supporting health service delivery through **173 clinics and sites**, and **6 hubs**, in the Copperbelt and Central provinces.

By **December 2025**, USAID DISCOVER-Health aims to:

- Initiate **141,462** people living with HIV on ART
- Circumcise **354,743** eligible males
- Provide PrEP to **115,377** clients
- Provide FP services to **412,482** new clients
- Screen **72,395** women living with HIV for cervical cancer
- Provide antenatal care services to **191,927** women
